### Latest WMP news

The Lake Monomonac Watershed Management Plan (WMP) is officially underway. This initiative is a really important step in protecting the long-term health of the lake we all care about. The WMP is a hands-on effort that combines scientific research with input from the community. It will build the data and conduct the analysis needed to develop a plan to reduce and ultimately reverse water quality impacts affecting the lake. The goal is to better understand where phosphorus and sediment are entering the lake. These sources may include factors such as stormwater runoff, paved and built surfaces, and shoreline properties. From there, the plan will define practical, realistic steps to reduce pollutants entering the lake. The plan will help create a coordinated path forward and bring together the state, the town, property owners, and the lake association so we're all working from the same playbook. This matters. The health of the lake depends on the choices we make moving forward, and this plan will help guide those decisions in a thoughtful and effective way. The completed plan will be shared with the community in late 2026. We'll keep you updated along the way.

## Spring is coming! Register your boats and update licenses

All motorized vessels, regardless of size, and sailboats 12 feet or longer must be **registered**. To register a boat in New Hampshire you must register in person at a DMV office or an authorized boat agent (many town clerk offices, Rindge included), or mail a completed boat registration application to the NH Dept. of Safety in Concord.

**Boat Licenses:** New Hampshire has a mandatory boating education law. Everyone 16 years of age and older who operates a motorboat over 25 horsepower on New Hampshire waters must have a boating education certificate.
